### Town of Pine Knoll Shores Board of Commissioners Regular Monthly Meeting October 11, 2017 6:00 PM

### Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Mayor Jones called the October 11, 2017 First Regular Monthly Meeting of the Pine Knoll Shores Board of Commissioners to order at 6 PM and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Also present for the meeting were Commissioners Clark Edwards, John Brodman, Larry Corsello, Fred Fulcher and Ted Goetzinger; Town Manager Brian Kramer; Assistant Town Manger/Finance Officer Julie Anderson; Fire Chief Jason Baker; Police Chief Ryan Thompson; Public Works Director Sonny Cunningham; Town Planner Kevin Reed; Town Clerk Sarah Williams; and Town Attorney Neil Whitford.

### Approval of the Agenda

The agenda was approved unanimously, with changes, on a motion by Commissioner Brodman with a second by Commissioner Edwards. Under the consent agenda, John Halada's name was removed from Chairman of the Strategic Planning Board and Jean McDanal's reappointment was added to the Parks and Recreation Committee.

### **Disclosures/Conflicts of Interest**

There were no disclosures or conflicts of interest.

### Announcements

Mayor Jones announced that the election day would be on November 7, the next Board of Commissioners meeting would be on November 8, the Veterans Day Parade in Morehead City would be on November 11, The Turkey Trot would be on Thanksgiving Day at McNeill Park, The Garden Club would be rededicating their Blue Star Memorial on November 9, The Christmas Flotilla would be on December 9, and the Christmas Parade would be on December 16.

### **Public Comment**

Suzanne Wheatcraft, 2 West Court, was concerned with transparency in government.

Bill Knecht, 238 Coral Dr, spoke in favor of a resolution to oppose offshore drilling and seismic testing.

### Presentation(s)

### **NCLM Presentation**

Retired Police Chief Tom Anderson from the North Carolina League of Municipalities presented Police Chief Thompson with the Risk Management Assessment Certification.

### Law Enforcement Certificate

Police Chief Ryan Thompson presented Corporal Jordan Seitter with the intermediate Law Enforcement Certificate.

### Kayak for the Warriors

Michelle Rademacher with Hope for the Warriors thanked Jean McDanal for coordinating Kayak for the Warriors and for all of the volunteers that had helped. She presented the Town with a book of pictures from both the 2017 foot race and the 2017 kayak race.



### Consent Agenda

The consent agenda, consisting of the minutes from the meetings of August 24 and September 13, 2017, board reappointments, surplus property resolution, and tax discoveries and releases, was approved unanimously on a motion by Commissioner Brodman with a second by Commissioner Goetzinger.

### Town Manager's Report

Manager Kramer reported that HB56 had passed, establishing a beach nourishment fund. There was the possibility of a beach nourishment project in FY 19; the Towns last beach nourishment had been about 5 years ago. The Town will start meeting with Moffat Nichol over the winter to start looking at design projects for the possible nourishment.

PKS Awarded 205j Grant: The Town was awarded the 205J grant to fund the Pine Knoll Shores Watershed Restoration Plan. Once the plan is approved, the Town will be eligible to receive 319 funding.

County Paramedic to Move Soon: The County Paramedic will be leaving Pine Knoll Shores between December 2016 and January 2017. The Town will cover both Pine Knoll Shores and Indian Beach for paramedic-level calls.

Town Hall Roof: The Town Hall roof is going to need the shingles replaced. It will likely be an FY19 Capital Improvement Project. Inspector Taylor is starting to gather quotes.

35 MPH on East End of Town: The Town has requested that the (seasonal) 35 MPH speed limit change on the east end of town remain permanent and synch with the Town of Atlantic Beach's speed limit schedule.

### Updates:

The U. S. Supreme Court denied the Nies petition. Commissioner Corsello would like to have a discussion on freeboard and building standards and Manager Kramer is looking for a speaker to come and talk about the topic. Commissioner Corsello said he would also like to hear from the insurance industry on the subject. A Coyote/ Pine Knoll Shores Wildlife Action Committee has been formed, and the dock ordinance is still with the Planning Board. Town Manager Kramer said that he was looking into the possibility of having a candidates table at Town Hall for those running in the election where they could display their material.

### **Staff Reports**

Chief Thompson informed the Board that the on December 2 at the Public Safety Building, there would be a veterinarian outreach from 10 a.m. -3 p.m. (the 2<sup>nd</sup> for the Town) and that on December 9, there would be a 2<sup>nd</sup> face behind the badge event at the Inn of Pine Knoll Shores from 9 a.m. -11 a.m..

Chief Baker informed the Board that the department's application to carry narcotics had been approved and once they were ordered, the department as a medic station would be fully functional.

Planner Reed informed the Board that the Town resiliency grant was a 3 part process and that Tower Com would be hosting lunch and in informational meeting on October 25 about the proposed monopole at the Country Club Crystal Coast. The purpose of the meeting would be to review site plans, design, etc.

Public Works Director Cunningham informed the Board that the NCDOT would be trimming the right-ofway and the Town will trim the interior streets. His department is continuing to spray for mosquitos, and the 2 elevated water tanks will be painted in 2018.



Town Clerk Williams informed the Board that Dr. Randall Etheridge from ECU and one his students were looking at the water quality of the canal. Once the reports are final, they will brief the Strategic Planning Committee. Based on the preliminary testing, the canal seems healthy.

### **Unfinished Business**

### Oil and Seismic Testing

Commissioner Fulcher expressed his concern about a resolution opposing oil and seismic testing and said he would not support a resolution. Commissioner Edwards made a motion to approve the resolution with a second by Commissioner Goetzinger, with discussion from Commissioner Corsello. Commissioner Corsello said he agreed with Commissioner Fulcher that it was not time to take action. He said that he was in not in favor of "... without any revenues or sharing..." being included in the resolution. Commissioner Brodman suggested striking that from the resolution and Commissioner Edwards amended his motion to strike that phrase. The resolution passed 4-1 with Commissioner Fulcher voting against.

### 2017 Annual Agenda and Commissioner Reports

Commissioner Brodman informed the Board that the CRC and the CRAC were supposed to meet in Wilmington, NC but had rescheduled for November 8&9 at the Doubletree in Atlantic Beach.

### **New Business**

### **Budget Amendment #2**

Budget Amendment #2 passed unanimously on a motion by Commissioner Edwards with a second by Commissioner Brodman.

### **Agenda Items for Next Meeting**

Commissioner Edwards asked for a brief on recycling and trash, and getting the word out. Mayor Jones would like to use some of the storm clean up funds towards cleaning up the right-of-way.

### **Public Comment**

Cindy Schersching, 148 Mimosa, thanked the Board for supporting the resolution opposing oil and seismic testing.

Christine Voss, 106 Locust Ct, presented information on oil and seismic testing and thanked the Board for passing the resolution.

### Adjournment

The Board Adjourned on a motion by Commissioner Edwards with a second by Commissioner Brodman that passed unanimously at 7:10 p.m.






